Global North and South

OECD

- 50% have a public administration gender policy
- 100% have public administration tracking systems
- 88% have online access to data, and 71% have highest quality data (another 24% have second-tier quality)

Non-OECD

- 37% have a public administration gender policy
- 73% have public administration tracking systems
- 20% have online access to data, and 10% have second- or highest-tier quality data









W/S Africa: Map of Data Availability












Arab States: Map of Data Availability






Arab States: Map of Data Quality












